### Thank You, Church Family!

Due to your generous giving, we have finished the year in a very strong way. December brought to the church a record \$124,095, surpassing our old record of 2019 by almost \$9,000. Even with the pandemic and two hurricanes, our church continues to be blessed.

At the end of 3<sup>rd</sup> guarter, we were \$68,000 behind on budgeted income. By the end of 2020, our church had made up all but \$22,000. Our Pastor and her staff did a great job holding down expenses which left us at year-end with a positive number of \$75,000. Our 2020 total income was \$567,336, with expenses of \$492,374. This will be a great jump-start into 2021.

Our needs will continue as we start on the hurricane repairs with limited insurance support. The needs of our community will also continue. So many people have given in some of our worst times. It's very uplifting to the church and your leadership team.

# First United Methodist Youth Got Bounce!

As Covid-19 continues to impact all of our lives, I consider what challenges and opportunities that it is bring to our youth. We began January hopeful that we could go back to in person meetings and were looking forward to starting a new Bible Study series. Plans changed, and when I announced to the youth that we would be pausing in person meetings to mitigate the spread of Covid-19, I watched their reactions. As you would expect they were disappointed and frustrated, but also understanding, and hopeful. We discussed ways to keep active during this time of no in person meetings and they requested to meet over Zoom. I was struck by their ability to adapt so quickly and accept the last-minute changes. I wondered if they were resilient or just resolved to a new unpredictable way of life. We began meeting over Zoom on Friday evenings and have been exploring our resiliency, it is a valuable skill that not everyone naturally has but it can be learned. Resilience is simply the ability to adapt well in the face of hard times, disasters, or high stress, how well do they "bounce?" We researched what the Bible tells us about resilience and the youth found great versus to lean on. Then we discussed ways to build their resilience. Our youth do have bounce, and we will continue to build these skills for the remainder of our pause.

Please encourage your youth to attend our weekly Zoom meetings, and have them invite a friend that may need a little help with their bounce.

The list was finished with chair-back covers featuring a brightly colored picture of Santa for the "Texas Aunts.'

We went back home where they wrapped and labeled every gift with so much excitement. After the Christmas visit was over, they came home brimming with stories of how each person reacted to their chosen gift. As they get older, I am sure what they RECEIVED might be forgotten, but I am just as sure they will remember GIVING much longer.
