Call someone, send cards out to people, leave a meal for someone on their doorstep (call and let them know though!), or pay for a meal for the car behind you in line at the fast-food restaurant. There are so many things we can do.

I hope and pray that the rest of this Lent season you will find and see and hear and experience the love of God in each and every day.

Is it Spring yet?!


I am looking forward to the warmer temperatures and sun shiny days as we are voyaging through Lent and headed into Easter.




