A hard time as we face the reality of the price that Jesus was willing to pay for us so that our sins are forgiven! Think about what that week was like for the disciples. Sunrise Service

At 6:40 a.m., April 4th, we will have a Sunrise Service for Easter morning at FUMC - Wesley Campus located at 701 N. Texas Street. Bring your lawn chairs and/or a blanket -- it may be cold or to use to sit on the ground. We will have a beautiful service of songs, a candle lighting, reading of God's Word and celebrating the resurrection of our Lord as the sun, the Son, comes up! This service will NOT be the same as the 10 a.m. service. So, you can come back at 9 a.m. for Sunday School and 10 a.m. for church. We hope you will come and share this beautiful early morning as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior!

10 a.m. Service

Our traditional Easter service will be at 10 a.m. in the Sanctuary. Masks are still required. We will have a flowering of the cross. We will have flowers available as you enter, however, you are welcome to bring flowers from your own garden if you desire! When you arrive (please come early), please go down and put your flower on the cross before the service. You are invited to take family photos following the service. We will have a great celebration through music, an anthem, God's Word, Holy Communion and prayer. We will keep social distance seating on the left as you enter and for those who want to sit closer, you can sit in any pew on the right as you enter. We look forward to celebrating with you.



Come at 6 pm for a service focused on Jesus' last night on this earth and the beautiful sacrament that He gives us through Holy Communion. Let us remember Jesus' last night on this earth as he prepared to give His life for each of us.

Good Friday

Have you ever wondered about the Stations of the Cross? Most people associate them with the Catholic Church however, protestants use them also. The stations are designed to help us remember what happened as he gave His life for us. This is a time to stop, remember and pray as Jesus took His journey to the Cross and gave His life for us. Come when you desire on Friday, from 7:30 a.m. - 1 pm, to the Fellowship Hall for a quiet time of prayer and reflection. We will have the Protestant Stations of the Cross (a couple of the pictures are different then the Catholic Church) set up around the room. When you enter into the Fellowship Hall area, there will be prayer booklets for you to pick up to help you with your time of reflection. As you move from station to station, your prayer booklet will give you a Scripture to read for that station, a reflection or point to ponder, and a prayer. You can always pray your own prayer. Please move quietly around the room, especially if others are present, and take your time to pray and remember that Christ gave His life for you on this day.

FUMC - DeRidder Music Ministry Notes

THE MOZART OF HIS TIME

If you attend the Maundy Thursday service in person or attend by way of the internet, you will hear our vocal quartet perform a Latin Renaissance piece by an individual that, chances are, you have never heard of. Josquin des Prez was a musical genius respected and revered by his peers much the way Mozart was revered. As I have mentioned before, a piece was sure to sell if a piece of music was attached to him whether or not he really penned the work. Publishers took advantage of that. Everyone acknowledge that if a piece of music was written by Josquin, it was a work of the highest musical craftsmanship available, but who was this individual whose name conjured up such thoughts. Josquin was born sometime in the 1450's in present day Belgium or France.

Much of his early life is speculative, not unusual in 15th century Europe. We can assume he showed promise as a church musician at an early age and studied musical composition, probably with composer Johannes Ockeghem, and sang in a church choir. In the 1470's through the rest of his life, Josquin went from province to province in France and Italy as a composer/singer in the service of many courts, churning out complicated, brilliant, ingenious works for church choirs and gaining fame, if not fortune. In the 1500's, publication of his musical works began in earnest. He retired ten years or so before his death in 1521.

While employed in Rome, as a member of the choir of the Sistine Chapel, Josquin carved his name into the wall "singer's balcony" of the chapel. It was tradition during that time for members of the choir to do this. Of course, we wouldn't even think about inscribing graffiti to the walls of a church,

especially a place as famous as the Sistine Chapel. During a restoration in the chapel in 1998, workers uncovered the long forgotten graffiti.

THE CROSS

"But as for Me, I am like a green olive tree in the house of God; I trust in the loving kindness of God forever and ever." -Psalm 52:8



I was recently given a small cross made of olive wood. As I held it, I was struck by its beauty and surprised by its shape, which fit perfectly in my palm, My interest WAS PIQUED WHEN I READ ON THE ACCOMPANYING CARD THAT THIS VERY CROSS WAS FOR TREE TRIMMINGS (THAT DID NOT HURT THE TREE) LOCATED AROUND BETHLEHEM, THE BIRTH PLACE OF [ESUS! I LEARNED THAT OLIVE TREES originated in the Holy Land. There are still olive trees IN ISRAEL ESTIMATED TO BE 2,000 YEARS OLD AND STILL BEARING FRUIT! THE OLIVE TREE IS THE MOST OFTEN NAMED tree in scripture. There are olive trees in the Garden of GETHSEMANE TODAY THAT WERE GROWN FROM OLIVE TREES PRESENT DURING THE TIME [ESUS PRAYED BEFORE THE crucifixion. We know these trees survived the flood, SHOWN TO US BY THE DOVE BRINGING AN OLIVE BRANCH BACK to Noah's Ark in Genesis. The oil from this tree has been USED FOR CENTURIES IN WORSHIP.

I suppose what I'm saying is this: I can admire and hold on to the cross - OR I can learn about how it affected Jesus in His time on Earth and now affects me in life-changing ways.
