

This picture is at the top of my "favorites" list. Let me introduce Rachel, one of the many greatgrandchildren in our family, adored by everyone. The explosion of curls makes me chuckle every time I see them. But this picture also holds a heart-rending memory. In the week before her Senior year, Marcie, my younger daughter, was in a serious car accident. She was flown to Lake Charles with a broken pelvis. As for Ted and I, fear was immense but our prayers were continuous. Later that day, as we stood by the ambulance preparing to take Marcie to New Orleans, my sister and her husband burst

out of the hospital doors. They had run past anyone who might stop them so they could see Marcie, say "I love you", and place the picture of their granddaughter in Marcie's hand — seconds

before the ambulance doors swung shut. We were told she clutched that picture in her hand the entire 4 hour trip. At the hospital she insisted they tape it to her I.V. pole so she could see it at all times. She showed everyone her little cousin whom she loved. They even put the picture in the recovery room for her to see after surgery. She focused on that "little girl with the little curl right in the middle of her forehead" during her 10-day hospital stay. The picture rode back to Dry Creek, once again in Marcie's hand.

What was it about that precious picture? From the moment Aunt Dot and Uncle Wayne placed it in Marcie's hand, she saw the promise that she would heal, that she would run and play with cousin "Rachey", that she would get past the painful journey of wheelchairs and learning to walk again. And walk, she did! Then ran! Even rejoining her basketball team! <u>The focus was on</u> <u>WHAT WAS TO COME — not the struggle to get</u> <u>there</u>. Thank you, Jesus, for loving us and teaching us the truth.
