Wednesday Evening Children's and Youth Ministry

Our Wednesday evenings are growing. The elementary children are working their way through the Fruits of the Spirit with Ms. Laura and the Youth continue to work on the Bible Basics series. Every Wednesday evening starts

with Children's Music Ministry at 5:30, then at 6:00 we will share a meal, then move on to lessons from 6:30 until 7:30.

We are looking for volunteers to help, there are a lot of opportunities to serve. Of course, we always can use an extra pair of hands in the classroom to assist the children with their projects. But we also, have an opportunity to provide, or cook, or serve and share a meal with the kids on Wednesday evenings. This is a mission within itself, the kids love to eat, parents welcome a night off from cooking, but most of all it is a unique opportunity to get to know the children in the church. We encourage the adults serving to sit with the children and get to know our future leaders. Additionally, it gives the children the opportunity to get to know the members of the church and lets them know they are a part of the big picture.

Sunday Early Worshipers - 9:00 AM

Every Sunday from 9:00-9:45 our Early Worshipers meet. All children in grades K-12 are invited to attend. We provide light breakfast foods and juice to get the morning started. Currently we are working our way through women of the Bible.

Children's Church - During Worship

All children in grades K-5 are welcome to attend. This is a one room lesson where we are currently exploring how Halloween fits into the life of a Christian. This time of year, is full of scary characters and gross stuff. How do we rectify that as a Christian? We open our Bibles to find that no one can create a bigger plot or better monster stories than our God. We have discussed the Nephilim and Giants in Genesis 6 who continue to make appearances in the Bible until the time of the great prophets (David and Goliath). Job's Leviathan that is a ginormous smoke-sorting, fire breathing serpent (perhaps the lock ness monster). We will finish with Apollyon's Locust, the superbugs (locusts) featured in Revelation 9. This will connect the cartoon universe with all of its myths to the truths that originate in Gods Word.


