Dear Church Family,


Lent is Upon Us

Ash Wednesday has always been very special to me and to the life of the church. Ash Wednesday starts the season of Lent where we take time to reflect on our humanness and sinfulness; we explore Jesus journey to Jerusalem and the cross; and we try to absorb the magnitude of God's love that He would be willing to lay down His life for the world, forgive us of our sins, and heal a broken relationship between us and God that, in turn, gives us the gift of resurrection and eternal life. You will have two opportunities for the Ash Wednesday service. The first service will be at 7 AM on Wednesday, March 2nd , in the Sanctuary. This service will be only 20 minutes long and should allow those going to work at 8 AM to be able to participate and reflect on the meaning of this time throughout the day. The second service will be at 6 PM in the Sanctuary and will involve a full service, including the choir. It will be about 50 minutes. I hope you can participate in one, (or both!), services and find a deep and meaningful start to the Lent season. All of this is to prepare us for Holy Week and Easter.

Unrevealed Until It's Season: Lenten Study

This year's Bible Study will be taking a different approach for our study. It will be through music and Scripture (don't forget the Psalms are music also, along with other parts of the Bible). No one has to worry about bringing their singing voices either! Author James Howell believes in the power of song to teach spiritual truths like "Hymns embed faith into the marrow of the soul." In Unrevealed Until Its Season, Howell takes us on a 40-day journey through well-loved hymns. This book is a meaningful Lenten devotional guide for small groups. <u>Unrevealed Until Its Season</u> has weekly themes include Praising God, Hymns About Jesus, Hymns of Forgiveness, Hymns of Vision, Hymns of Beauty, Hymns of Holy Week, and Hymns of Easter. Howell ponders phraes from old and new hymns, such as Be Thou My Vision, Hymn of Promise, All Creatures of Our God and King, For Everyone Born, Come, Thou Fount of Every Blessing, Lift High the Cross, and When I Survey the Wondrous Cross. Come and join us on Wednesday nights from 6-7:15 pm, in the Sanctuary, and explore the hymns and Scripture that teach us about this season. We will meet starting Wednesday, March 9th and conclude the Wednesday after Easter. The book is \$12, and should be here for you the Sunday before Ash Wednesday – February 27th. *Come and enjoy!*

There are few works in the history of music that effect listeners more profoundly than Gustav Mahler's "Resurrection" Symphony. Mahler's music will humor you, frighten you, sadden you, and ultimately cause your soul to soar on eagle's wings in the final twenty minutes. It is an exhausting (in an awesome way) ninety minutes of music that explores the essence of human experience from life to death, and finally life after death. Every human tragedy, emotion, and circumstance can be interpreted in every musical idea contained in its pages. It is a deeply personal listening experience. Each person brings their own life experiences and beliefs with them to the concert hall and these experiences and beliefs shape how we listen and interpret the music we hear. As followers of Christ, nothing is as exciting and moving as scripture concerning the resurrection of the dead to new life when that trumpet sounds, and the last forty minutes of the work deal with such events without actually quoting scripture. Humanist writers have tried unsuccessfully to downplay this aspect of the work by showing that Mahler was Jewish and that the work speaks to mankind's resurrection to new attitudes and a reawakening of the human condition on this earth rather than a Biblical resurrection. Written for large orchestra (80-100 players), large choir (as many choristers as possible) and two vocal soloists, this masterpiece has plenty of loud and obnoxious moments but just as many tender, gentle moments. It is such a "tour de force" that when it's over, you barely notice that time has passed. You will be on the edge of your seat most of the time in anticipation of what you will hear next. On Friday, April 29, the chancel choir will take a day trip to Houston to hear the Houston Symphony Orchestra and Chorus in a concert performance of the Symphony No. 2 in C minor "Resurrection" by Austrian composer Gustav Mahler (1860-1911). However, you do not have to be a member of the choir to go with us. Everyone is invited. The ticket price is \$39 per person. You may make ticket payments to Erin Tepley in the church office. Tickets must be purchased by March 18. We will also go the Houston Museum of Fine Art in the afternoon. Group ticket information for the museum is unknown at this time.

I am going to be frank as I visit with you today. Our lives change continually. People change. The weather changes (run the heater in the morning and the air conditioner that night). Ted piled all of us in the truck, hooked the boat on the back and took us fishing. When we all had poles in the water, Ted said he read something that he wanted us to know. Erma Bombeck had some good advice. She said, "Ask yourself this: Is it a lump in your potatoes, a lump in your throat, or a lump in your breast? Then act accordingly". The discussion started off with the girls being embarrassed that he said THAT word until he explained that every day people find out they have cancer. There was just the sound of the water on the boat while we all 4 thought of the comparison of the 3 choices: Potatoes - Emotions — Life & Death. He connected these questions, also, to our conversation with God. God never changes. He welcomes us to pray about little things, big things and life-changing things. God is NOT just a last ditch option. "I have called upon you, for you will answer me, O God; Incline your ear to me, hear my speech." Psalm 17:6 Praise God for who He is. We honor God when we humbly come before Him and praise Him for His greatness. He deserves all our praise. Ask God to meet our needs by sharing our requests with Him. I ask myself these three questions when I have a difficult change. It helps me react more calmly. Even more importantly, it urges me to bring everything to my good, good Father. I hope all of your troubles are just "a lump in your potatoes!"
