Annual Conference

Many of you have been asking how Annual Conference went in Baton Rouge. I am also thrilled that several of you watched some of the meetings and worship services on-line. The worship services were so powerful and wonderful. A lot of beautiful music and powerful preaching. We did some of the regular work of the conference including voting on the budget, nominations for conference committees and other needs. Sadly, we also had five congregations closed this year due to complications from Covid and hurricanes.

There were also nine smaller congregations that have chosen to leave the United Methodist Church even before General Conference has met. With grace and a lot of tears, we gracefully let them go and blessed them in their ministries.

There was also another sad time that also showed grace. The anti-racism committee gave a very powerful report. The Louisiana St legislature is in special session, and one of their tasks is redraw district lines. They have been ordered by federal court to make more than one district in the Baton Rouge area to include a predominantly African American vote. The anti-racism committee brought a resolution that, if it passed, would be sent to the legislature supporting that there be fair district lines drawn that would give equal representation. This vote overwhelmingly passed. Sadly, what happened next was that there was a fair amount of people that voted against it. The gasp across the room was audible. It broke our hearts. A young African American man, in his twenties, stood up asking to speak, which the Bishop granted. He poured out his heart expressing how hurtful it was to see people from the United Methodist Church, his church of faith, voting against African Americans. He broke down in tears, a large group of us stood up with him to show our support as he gave his address to the floor. He spoke beautifully. The people of the conference stood up and applauded him and praised him when he was finished. Grace abounded when a moment of great hurt occurred. That is what Christ did in his ministry also. I am proud of what we did in that moment as a conference. For God so loves the WORLD....

On our last night, there was a beautiful ordination service that reminded us all that the United Methodist Church continues to move forward to proclaim the Gospel and to make disciples of all the world in Jesus' name.
