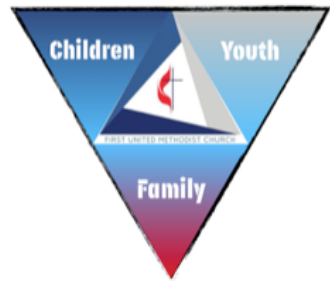

Where is God on Sunday Mornings? ...In the Church Nursery Too! The Children's Ministries seems to be continually looking for Nursery staff or volunteers to provide care on Wednesday evenings and Sunday mornings. I asked myself why, and determined that perhaps people don't understand how truly valuable the position is to the life of the Church and its people.

In an article by Tony Kummer (link below) he laid out 7 compelling reasons why the church nursery is so valuable. I thought I would share them and ask that you ponder and pray for this valuable service our church offers. God is there. The Bible has specific promises about God's presence when children are welcomed and loved in Jesus' name. Mark 9:36-37 states "and he took a child, and set him in the midst of them: and when he had taken him in his arms, he said unto them, "Whosoever shall receive one of such children in my name, receiveth me: and whosoever shall receive me, receiveth not me, but him that sent me."

WOW, what an honor! It helps others. When a child is being cared for, parents can focus on worship, rather than struggling to keep them quiet and still during service. It not only refreshes that parent but allows for their spiritual growth. Additionally, in a way, your service is making it possible for the Pastor to fulfill her ministry.

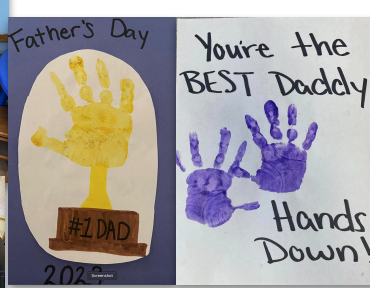
- **Baby's first impressions.** The first (and sometimes lasting) feelings a child will have toward church is formed in the nursery department. The most special assignment. When you serve in the nursery, you are being entrusted with the most important (and vulnerable) members of the church family. There is no greater treasure on this side of heaven than the little ones God has given us. You must be someone special to have a job that is so important.
- **Your own growth.** Your service is essential for your own spiritual growth. You may have never looked at it this way, but a growing Christian is always a serving Christian. Jesus was known for putting others first, when you serve in the church nursery you are walking in his example.
- **Visitors' first impressions.** The church nursery is the first contact young families will have with your church. Your friendly greeting and exceptional care for their children can make a great first impression for your church. If they don't feel like their children are safe, they will not return – and rightly so.
- **Front-line prayers.** Your service in the church nursery is a powerful opportunity for prayer. If every nursery worker would spend several minutes praying over the children in their care, imagine how God might begin to change this coming generation. There is no better way to create an environment of spiritual nurture than to pray while you serve in the nursery.

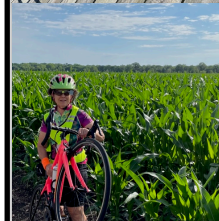
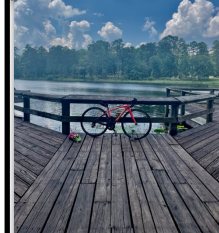

The 5mile Route displayed riders of great endurance and diversity! One participant and his bicycle took a tumble on the pavement, got patched with a Mother's handy dandy bandaid, and returned to peddle the course. Our adult "sweeper", who stayed at the back of the pack told of great love and support for the bandaid rider. He said that the best part of his day was seeing and hearing the profound concern of comrades for their friend. The Bladen family worked hard to impress the crowd with their fantastic grilling talents. They also supplied a list of funny jokes for the children to share with everyone. That was a blast!

Grant provided the necessary gear and expertise that was required for the music and the mic. Many people worked hard to organize and provide the meal, the snowcones, the entertainment, and the opportunity for comradeship to grow. About the Journey: The idea of a bicycle ride to earn money for the various missions of the UMW was hatched in 2018. The first event began in the summer of 2019. With 1 truck, 1 driver, and 4 cyclists, a journey of 300 miles set the stage for a new era of fundraising. The team rode bicycles from one town to another, staying the night in churches and homes. The expedition had profound effects on all those who contributed. The next 2 years were marked with restrictions of Covid 19. I rode the 300 miles solo for each year. My family drove the support vehicles. Riding for hundreds of miles, all over the state, during Covid restrictions was a huge spiritual journey. I could write a short story about that experience. The summer of 2022 was bright and beautiful for all who wanted to ride for missions. Several teenagers and adults gathered at our Bus Barn for early morning briefings and prayer before tackling the tarmac. Support drivers were super enthusiastic and encouraged us to safely persevere. The fellowship was amazing. Circumstances were strained for 2023. I had to reroute my plans and expectations for a 300 mile journey. Aggravation was an unwelcome component that your prayers and patience helped dissipate. The Journey was completed! Thanks to everyone for their contributions to the missions of the United Women of Faith. You may have heard mutterings about spandex clad mature (and NOT so mature) individuals gathering at our Bus Barn, then creating a joyful ruckus all around town. It's true and Pastor approved. Our children's choir, while steadily increasing in the number of voices, has also steadily improved the quality of their performances in the service of God. Not only is it fun to watch these cute kids, but it has become a pleasurable listening experience. The same can be said of our hand bell ensemble. Although their cuteness is debatable (lol), there is no denying they have grown musically. Numbering ten dedicated individuals, it is equal in size to the hand bell ensemble of FUMC of Lake Charles.

However, the chancel choir at FUMC of Lake Charles has around thirty-five singers, whereas our Sunday morning chancel choir is presenting an anthem, we can count on only eight singers.
